Dvorak & Swift - A dual interview

The 'Fictional Interview' method is an innovative pedagogical method that can be used in the classroom to help students better understand and internalise complex topics and concepts. The method is based on the idea that students are actively involved in the learning process by placing themselves in a fictitious situation and putting themselves in the role of people who embody certain topics or concepts.

In this case, the fictional interview method is used to find out the similarities and differences between the artist biographies and musical work of Taylor Swift and Antonin Dvorak. Through the interview, the pupils not only get to know the two artists and their work better but also learn how to draw comparisons and differences between different personalities and their artistic creations.

The fictional interview therefore provides an ideal opportunity to organise lessons in a playful and creative way, while at the same time encouraging pupils' critical thinking, language skills and artistic perception.



Procedure:

Phase 1

Allocation of roles and familiarisation

The class is divided into three groups of approximately equal size. Each group receives different work materials and work assignments:

- Group A (journalist) receives the factual texts on both people and works out questions to emphasise the differences and similarities between the two.
 - Group B (Taylor Swift) receives a profile and interview with Taylor Swift and familiarises themselves with the role of Taylor Swift. Characteristics and special features of Swift's music and musical career should be emphasised.
 - Group C (Antonin Dvorak) receives a profile and interview with Antonin Dvorak and familiarises themselves with the role of Dvorak. Characteristics and special features of Dvorak's music and musical career should be emphasised.
- a. Group A work assignment:
 - Read the work materials and highlight the most important information.
 - Organise the texts into sections and create questions about them.
 - Focus on the differences and similarities between the two musicians.
 - b. Group B & C work assignment:
 - c. Read the work materials and highlight the most important information.

Phase 2

The Talkshow

Then one person each from groups A, B & C sit down and conduct an interview, led by the journalist (group A).

Alternatively, the interview can also be played in front of the class in plenary.

Phase 3

Final Quiz

At the end of the unit, a short quiz can be carried out with the whole class to consolidate the content of the interview. The quiz can be carried out according to the '1,2 or 3' principle, which encourages the pupils to move.



Printable work assignments:

Group A work assignments – Journalists

- Read the work materials and highlight the most important information.
- Organise the texts into sections and create questions about them.
- Focus on the differences and similarities between the two musicians

Example questions a journalist could ask:

- How did you get into music?
 - How important are prizes for your music to you?
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Group B work assignments – Antonin Dvorak

- Read the work materials and highlight the most important information.
 - Divide the texts into sections and work out the special features and characteristics of the musician and his/her career.
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Group C work assignments – Taylor Swift

- Read the work materials and highlight the most important information.
- Divide the texts into sections and work out the special features and characteristics of the musician and his/her career.



Interview Dvorak (Group B)

Interviewer: Hello, Mr Dvorak. It's great that we can talk to you today.

Antonin Dvorak: Hello, thank you very much for the invitation. I'm glad to be here.

Interviewer: Can you tell us how you compose new pieces of music?

Antonin Dvorak: Of course. When I write music, I let the ideas flow naturally. I don't force myself to find ideas or to put a piece into a certain structure. Instead, I let melodies and harmonies emerge by themselves, almost as if they were already there and I'm just discovering them.

Interviewer: That sounds exciting. Do you have an example of a piece that was created in this way?

Antonin Dvorak: Yes, my 'New World Symphony' is a good example. When I wrote the piece, I was inspired by the music of the Native Americans and African Americans that I got to know during my time in America. I tried to integrate these influences into the music, but I didn't have an exact plan as to how. I just let the music develop and the result was successful.

Interviewer: Your music often has elements of folk music. Why is that important to you?

Antonin Dvorak: I believe that folk music is the basis for great music. It appeals to the human spirit and has a timeless quality. When I incorporate folk music into my own compositions, I don't try to reinvent it. Rather, I want to capture the essence of this music and incorporate it into my own works.

Interviewer: You have travelled a lot. How have these experiences influenced your music?

Antonin Dvorak: Every place has its own sounds and rhythms that impress me. Whether it's the folk music of the Czech countryside or the spirituals of the American South, all these experiences have in one way or another influenced my music.

Interviewer: Why do you think your music appeals to such a wide audience?

Subject text Dvorak (Group A)

Known for: Antonin Dvorak was a renowned composer who is considered one of the most important representatives of Czech music. Some of his most famous works are the symphony 'From the New World', the cello concerto in B minor and the opera 'Rusalka'.
